## Award Allowances

A fixed living allowance of SEK 38,889 (approximately \$4,600 USD and untaxed) per month for up to nine months. The dependent allowance does not apply.

A separate monthly housing allowance of SEK 9,000 (approximately \$1,050) is provided. Grantees are encouraged to arrange housing through host institution/adviser.

## Estimated Travel and Relocation Allowance for Grantee

Round-trip travel for grantee only.

## Additional Dependent Benefits

Public schools are usually free of charge from primary through the upper-secondary level and many public and private schools offer English instruction through primary and upper-secondary levels. Personal funds are usually necessary for accompanying dependents to complement grant benefits, including the additional cost of daycare and international schools. Please note that children may be eligible to receive subsidized daycare and free schooling as long as the other parent is working or studying. However, it is the responsibility of the grantee to contact any schools and daycare centers directly to negotiate the terms of stay and applicable costs.

- Teach at the master's level in human rights, international law, international organizations, civil and political rights, humanitarian law, refugee law, minority and indigenous rights and international labor standards (approx 30 hours/semester).
- Teach human rights training courses in Lund on topics such as civil and political rights, good governance and anti-corruption efforts and human rights of women.
- Supervise master's students in their thesis research and writing.
- The grantee may also participate in collaborative research and teach at the Faculty of Law at Lund University.

## Award Length and Period

Either one semester (4.5 months) or two semesters (9 months); a nine month grant period is preferred.

- Two-semester grants must begin in September 2022
- One semester grants must begin in either September 2022 or January 2023.

Founded in 1666, Lund University is now the largest site of higher education and research in the Nordic countries, with its 42,500 students and 6,000 faculty and staff.

The Raoul Wallenberg Institute of Human Rights and Humanitarian Law (RWI) is an independent academic institution, established in 1984, which promotes human rights through research, training and education. It has one of the largest human rights libraries in northern Europe. The RWI offers a two-year undergraduate program in human rights and two master's programs, one of which is in international human rights law and the other in human rights and intellectual property rights law. The RWI offers human rights capacity building programs in Sweden and abroad, carries out applied or policy-based research and issues five series of publications, as well as related books and journals. It has approximately 100,500 residents and is the 12th largest municipality in Sweden. All teaching and potential student supervision will be in English.

A letter of invitation should not be sought.
