### Stipend

28,000 Norwegian kroner (NOK) per month for stays of 3-10 months for research. An additional monthly allowance of 2,000 NOK per accompanying dependent per month is provided for up to three accompanying dependents. If two people in the same family receive Fulbright grants to Norway, no dependent allowance will be provided for additional family members.

The monthly stipend is sufficient to cover basic living costs in Norway for the grantee and up to three accompanying dependents.

### Estimated Travel and Relocation Allowance

International travel for scholar only. Small allowance for excess baggage.

### Dependent Tuition Allowance

### Grant Activity

Conduct relevant research at PluriCourts - Center for the Study of the Legitimate Roles of the Judiciary in the Global Order.

The PluriCourts Center studies the legitimate roles of the judiciary in the global order. The focus is on international courts and tribunals in criminal law, the environment, human rights, investment and trade by scholars in law, political science and philosophy.

Research at PluriCourts concerns the origins of International Courts, how they function and their effects. PluriCourts draws on these findings to assess them by principles of legitimacy and develops plausible, sustainable models for each court and their interaction.

In addition to research, selected scholars may also be invited to provide guest lectures and/or participate in seminars.

### Grant Length

Three to ten months. The requested grant length must be justified and clearly stated in the application. A detailed project plan is especially important for proposed stays of an entire academic year.

### Grant Dates

Grants may begin any time between August 2021 and January 2022. The last month of the grant can be no later than June

2022. Grants are awarded in increments of whole months only.

PluriCourts will provide office space for selected scholars.

All U.S. grantees to Norway have two opportunities to gather as a group. The first is an orientation program held in Oslo in August. The second is a seminar in February during which grantees present on their projects followed by a weekend at a ski resort near Lillehammer. Domestic travel and lodging expenses for these gatherings are covered by the Fulbright Foundation. In addition, these expenses are covered for dependent family members of grantees for the seminar/ski weekend, which is a highlight of the Fulbright year.

## **Additional Qualification Information**

Applications are welcome from people with JDs and LL.M.s who are currently engaged in research.

Please note that dual U.S.-Norway citizens are not eligible for the Fulbright program with Norway. Applications will not be considered if the applicant is currently residing in Norway or will be residing in Norway during the year preceding the grant.

All letters of recommendation should be submitted by the application deadline.

## **Additional Language Requirement**

The working language of the PluriCourts is English, and all public lecturing will be in English.

For research grant activity, language fluency sufficient to complete the research project is required. Feasibility of conducting research must be demonstrated in both the project statement and, for research that is not in English, the language self-evaluation form of the Fulbright application.

## **Invitation Requirement**

A letter of invitation is required

**Special Award Benefits**

One-time grants of up to 2,000 NOK are available for scholars to use for grant-related travel in Norway or Europe.

Scholars are also eligible to participate in the Fulbright Intercountry Lecturing Program. The program provides opportunities for professional enrichment and cultural experience outside of Norway through short visits to give presentations in other participating European countries. Inter-country Lecturing travel is covered by the Fulbright commission and host institution in the country the scholar travels to.
