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Why Fulbright?

Fulbright is transformational.

Why Fulbright?

Fulbright is supportive.

- **70% of applicants** engage with IIE staff
- **Continued support** while in country from IIE and host country staff
- Access to **Fulbright alumni** as a resource





Eligibility for U.S. Scholar Program

- **U.S. citizenship**
- **Degree and experience**, as required by award:
 - Ph.D. or other terminal degree
 - MA and higher education teaching or professional experience
 - Professional and/or artistic experience with substantial accomplishments
 - Teaching experience as required
- **Compliance with policies** on previous Fulbright Scholar awards: two year waiting period between Fulbright U.S. Scholar award and next application





Application Components

Requirements:

- ✓ Application Form
- ✓ Project Statement
- ✓ Curriculum Vitae or Resume
- ✓ 2 Letters of Recommendation
- ✓ Language Proficiency Report *(if required)*
- ✓ Letter of Invitation *(if required)*

Supplemental Materials:

- ✓ Course outlines or syllabi *(for teaching)*
- ✓ Reference list *(for research)*
- ✓ Portfolio submissions *(for artists, architects, and journalists)*





Application Cycle

FEBRUARY	Competition Opens
SEPTEMBER 15	Application Deadline
SEPTEMBER	Program staff conducts technical reviews for completeness
OCTOBER – NOVEMBER	U.S. peer review
NOVEMBER – JANUARY	Applicants notified of status. Recommended applications are sent to host countries and to the Fulbright Foreign Scholarship Board.
JANUARY – JUNE	Final decisions are made
JUNE – ONWARD	Participants prepare for departure

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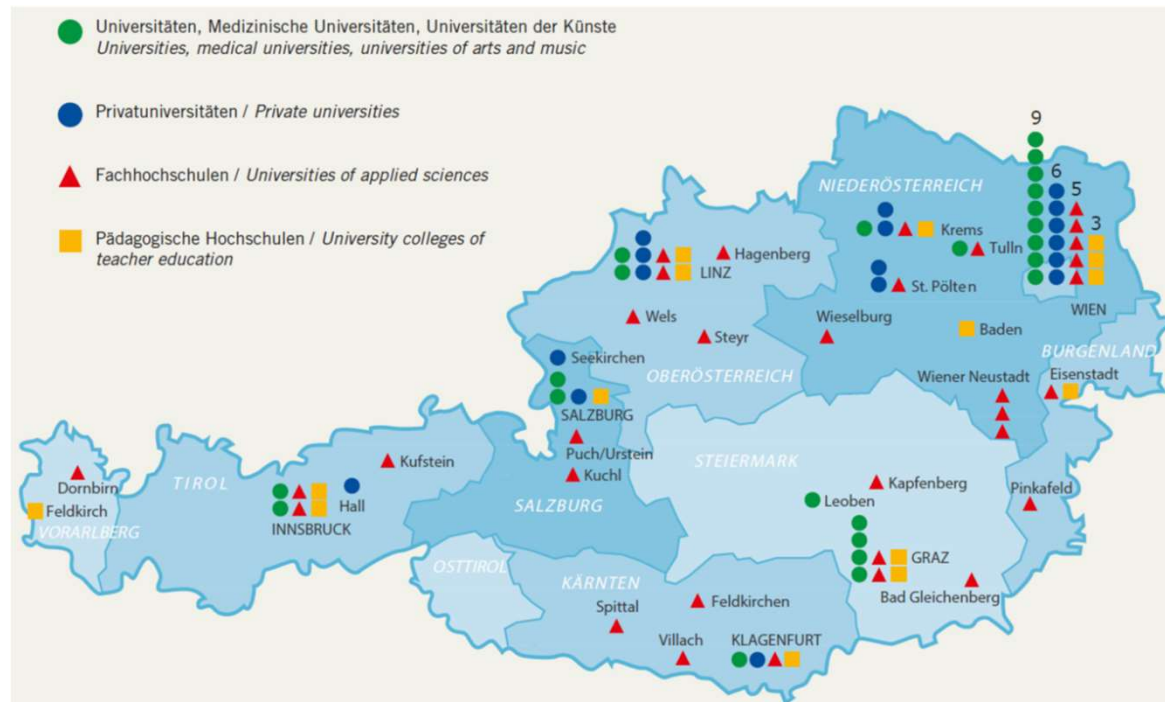


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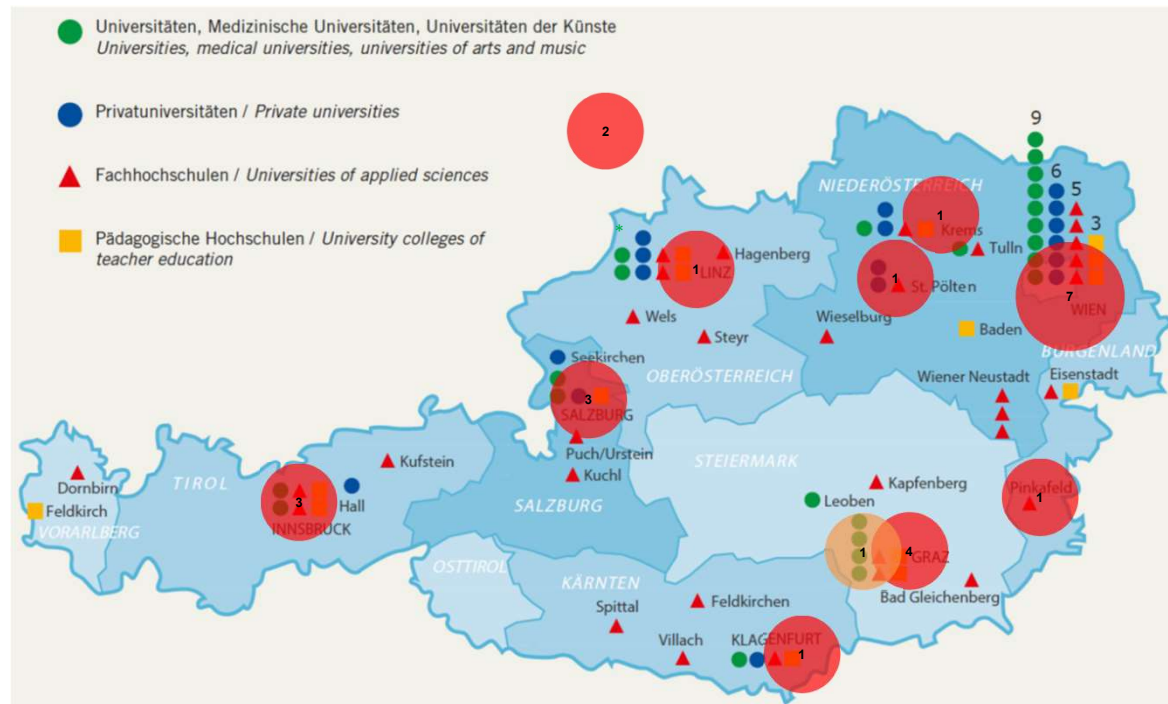


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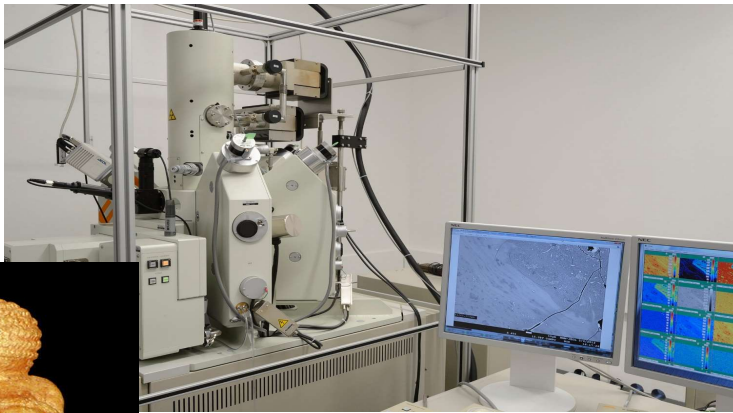

Fulbright-Natural History Museum Vienna Visiting Researcher



- Four months research
- Open to all level of scholars and researchers
- Letter of invitation preferred
- **All disciplines relevant to the collections and resources of the Natural History Museum**



Fulbright-University of Applied Sciences Burgenland Visiting Professor

- Four months teaching/research
- Open to all level of Scholars
- Letter of invitation is optional
- **Architecture, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Sciences, and Physics, Urban Planning/Studies**





Fulbright–Alpen-Adria-Universität Klagenfurt Visiting Professor



- Four months research/teaching
- Mid career and senior scholars
- Letter of invitation is optional
- **Anthropology, Business, Communication, Computer Science, Economics, Education, Environmental Sciences, Geography, IT, Linguistics, Philosophy, Public Administration, Sociology**



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Fulbright-Botstiber Visiting Professor of Austrian-American Studies in Austria

- Four months research, teaching, professional project
- Artists, Professionals, Early Career, Mid career and Senior Scholars
- Letter of invitation is preferred
- **American Studies, Non-U.S. Area Studies, Art History, Arts, Economics, Education, Film/Cinema Studies, American and Non-U.S. History, Journalism, Law, Literature (Both U.S. and Non-U.S.), Music, Philosophy, Political Science and Sociology**

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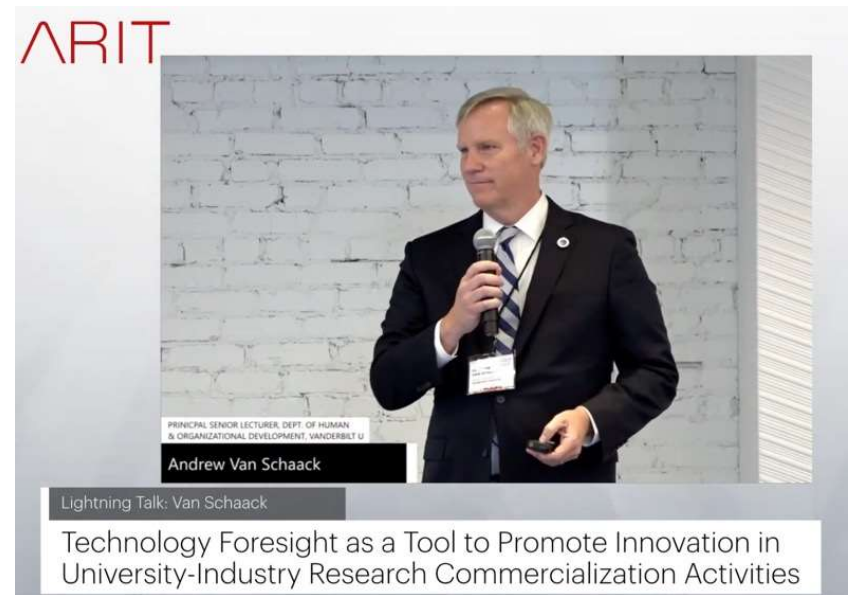
