Are there samples of successful applications to review?	Thank you for your question! We do not have samples of applications to review but we have detailed application steps on our website: https://fulbrightscholars.org/us-scholar-awards#steps
So if someone qualifies for more than one award, Say a 'distinguished scholar' in 'business' who wants to visit the University of Cairo. Would they apply to all the awards? Or just one? And what are the probabilities of getting each of the awards? Thank you for the answer.	Thank you for your question! You can only apply to one Fulbright award per competition cycle. Therefore, you would need to pick which one resonates more with you. And due to policy, we are not able to give out that information.
What was the name of the school that was in the last slide image?	Ain Shams University was on the last slide
If you make an award in one discipline for the all-disciplines award - will you be less likely to make an award in the same discipline for that same award the next years (all else being equal)? Thanks.	You are always evaluated on what you put forward for that specific competition; your previous applications have no bearing on the review process for your next try! If you've applied in the past and would consider reapplying, I encourage you to do so
Which of the awards typically get the most applications?	We aren't able to share # of applications for specific awards, but we always encourage you to consider the award that's most specific for you as a scholar and for your project (e.g., if you're business faculty, I'd encourage you to consider the business award for Egypt instead of the all disciplines award)
Do you look positively at comparative research? Say comparing response to inflation in Egypt versus another country?	Comparative research is just as welcome as any other eligible topic for Egypt's awards. If you're comparing with another country's situation, you should simply focus your project statement on what you plan to accomplish while *in Egypt*.
Any information on the amount of stipend and other allowances? Typical living cost in Egypt?	Thank you for your question! Stipend and allowances information can be found in the award benefits tab of each award.
